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Facts

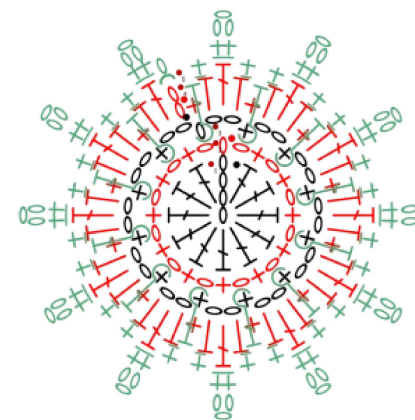
Yarn Alt. 1 – *Scheepjes Stoned Washed XL* or *Drops Paris*
Alt. 2 – *Scheepjes Stoned Washed* or *Scheepjes Catona*

Hook Alt. 1 – 3.5 mm
Alt. 2 – 2.5 mm

Size Alt. 1 – 4×4 inches (10×10 cm)
Alt. 2 – 2.7×2.7 inches (7×7 cm)

Alternatives

The pattern below can be adjusted, depending on your own preferences. For example:

- The initial ch on round 1 can be made with a magic ring.
- You can start each round with standing stitches where ever possible, instead of ch.
- You can end rounds with either an invisible join (as shown in the pictures below) or with a sl st .
- I prefer to weave in the ends after each round, for best result. You can chose to do that after finishing all rounds as well.

ch 4 (= ch 1, 1 dc), 11 dc in the first ch. Tighten the ring by pulling the short yarn thread. Finish with an invisible join. (Total 1 ch, 12 dc).



Start with ch 4



1 dc in first ch



Round 1: ch 4, 11 dc in first ch of 4



Invisible join step 1:
Stitch through the first dc



Invisible join step 2:
Stitch the back loop of last dc



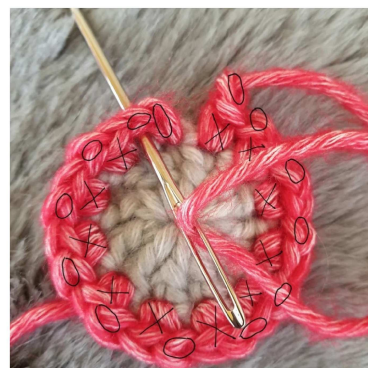
Round 1 done

Change color, *1 sc (=ch 1 in first repetition), ch 1* 12 times. Finish with an invisible join. (Total 12 ch, 12 sc).



Round 2: Total 13 ch, 11 sc



Invisible join step 1:
Stitch through the first ch-1 sp



Invisible join step 2:
Stitch through the last ch



Round 2 done

Change color, *1 sc (=Ch 1 in first repetition) in ch 1-sp, ch 2* 12 times, Skip the first ch and finish with 1 sl st in the first ch-2 sp. (Total 12 sc, 24 ch, 1 sl st).



Round 3: Total 13 ch, 11 sc



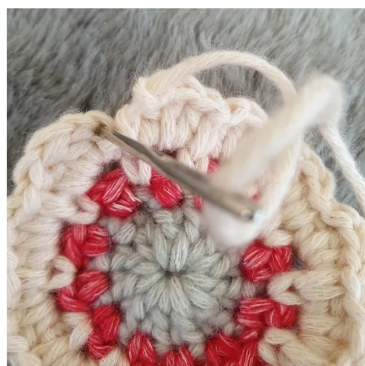
Finish with a sl st in ch-2 sp

«1 hdc (=ch 2 in first repetition), 1 dc, 1 hdc» in ch-2 sp, 1 sc through the sc from round 3 12 times. Finish with an invisible join. (Total 12 sc, 24 hdc, 12 dc).



Round 4: Total 2 ch, 12 sc, 23 hdc, 12 dc



Invisible join step 1:
Stitch through the first ch



Stitch through the back loop of the last sc



Round 4 done

Change color. This round is crocheted in BLO. *1 sc (= ch 1 in first repetition) in first hdc after a sc, «1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc» in dc, 1 sc in hdc, 1 FPdc around sc from round 3* 12 times. Finish with an invisible join. (Total 36 ch, 48 sc BLO, 12 FPdc).



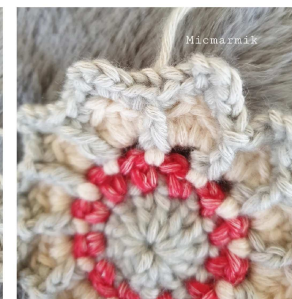
Round 5: Total 37 ch, 47 sc BLO, 12 FPdc

Loop

This part is used to hang the flower, for example as decoration in a Christmas tree.

1

ch 1 in white st on the back of the flower, *ch 1* 27 times, 1 sl st in white st next to the first st. Attach the loose yarn ends. (Total 28 ch, 1 sl st).



Turn the flower to the back side



Ch 1 in the st



ch 28 and join with a sl st in st next to the first st



Almost done



Attach the loose yarn ends

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Symbols explained (US terms):











*... * ... times
Repeat the instructions, for example:
"**ch 1, 2 sc* 5 times*"
would mean
"*ch 1 followed by 2 sc, repeated five times*"

** ... ** ... times
Short repeats within a longer ones, for example:
"**ch 1, **1 sc** 2 times* 5 times*"
would mean
"*ch 1 and a repeat of 2 sc; all repeated 5 times*"

(Total ...)
Sums up number of used stitches, for example:
"*1 sc (= ch 1), ch 2. (Total 2 ch, 1 sc)*"
would mean
"*amounts to 3 ch, used as 2 ch + 1 sc*"

(=...)
Replacement for first stitch on a round, for example:
"*ch 3 (=1 dc)*"
would mean
"*ch 3 used instead of 1 dc as the initial stitch*"

«...» in ...
Stitches to be crocheted in the same stitch, for example:
"*«3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc» in the next stitch*"
