The story behind the pattern.

Last summer I crocheted a lot of Dahlia-Daisy squares, but I never made a pattern of the squares only of the Dahlia-Daisy flower. The Dahlia-Daisy square can be crocheted in two different ways, hence the name. One variant becomes a Dahlia and the other a Daisy. Read more about it [here](#).

Introduktion

First you need to do some Dahlia-Daisy flowers, as many as you need. Then you can make Daisy squares!

The stitches in the pictures are the stitches I crocheted (not what they count as).

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Facts

Yarn Scheepjes Catona – 100% Mercerized cotton

Hook 2.5 mm

Size 2.95 x 2.95 inches (7.5 x 7.5 cm)

Stitches	sl st	ch	sc	dc	BLO

Symbols

... Repeat stitches

... Repeat stitches within repetition

«...» Crocheted in the same or given stitch

Alternatives

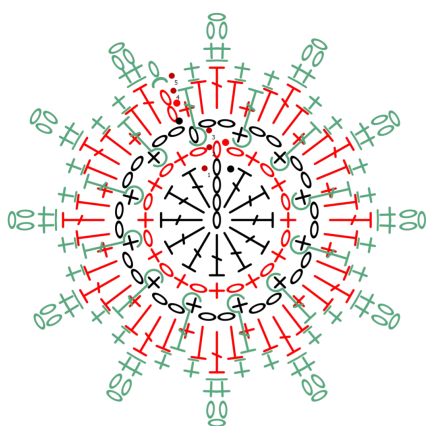
The pattern below can be adjusted, depending on your own preferences. For example:

- The initial ch on round 1 can be made with a magic ring.
- You can start each round with standing stitches wherever possible, instead of ch.
- You can end each round with an invisible join where ever possible, instead of a sl st.
- I prefer to weave in the ends after each round, for best result. You can choose to do that after finishing all rounds as well.

Dahlia-Daisy flower (round 1-5)

Crochet some Dahlia-Daisy flowers. Use the chart below or you can download a PDF of the pattern Dahlia-daisy flower on my blog (blog.micmarmik.se), [click here](#).

When you have crocheted all the Dahlia-Daisy flowers you need attach all loose yarn threads, if you haven't already.





Daisy square (round 6-9)

R.6 Now we turn the Dahlia-Daisy flower into a Daisy square.

Change color. Turn the flower so the back is up. Start the round in the stitch that goes around sc r.4 (made by FPdc r.5).

1 sc in the stitch that goes around sc r.4, ch 5, skip two stitches that goes around sc r.4 4 times. Finish with 1 sl st in the first sc. Do not cut the yarn.

(Total 20 ch, 4 sc)



R.7

Continue with the same color. The flower is still face down.

1 sl st to ch-5 sp, *<8 dc> (counts as ch 3, 7dc in first repetition) around ch-5 sp, ch 4* 4 times.

Finish with 1 sl st in the first dc. Do not cut the yarn.

(Total 1 sl st, 16 ch, 32 dc)

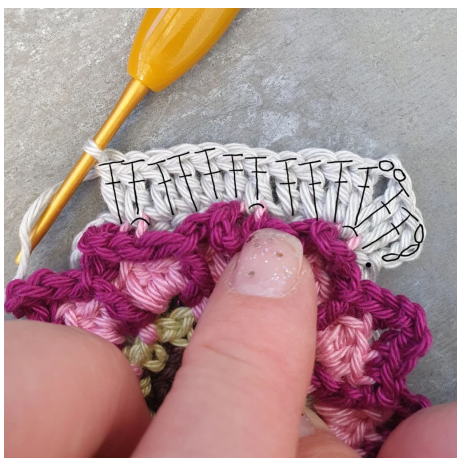




R.8 Continue with the same color. Turn the flower so the front is up. On this round we attach the flower petals.

1 sl st around ch-4 sp, *«2 dc» (counts as ch 3, 1 dc in first repetition) around ch-4 sp, «1 dc BLO, ch 2, 1 dc BLO» in dc r.4 (between 2 sc r.5) and around ch-4 sp, «2 dc» around ch-4 sp, 1 dc in dc, 1 dc BLO in dc r.4 (between 2 sc r.5) and in next dc, 4 dc, 1 dc BLO in dc r.4 (between 2 sc r.5) and in next dc, 1 dc in dc* 4 times. Finish with 1 sl st in first dc. Do not cut yarn.

(Total 8 ch, 56 dc)



R.9

Continue with the same color.

3 sc (counts as 1 ch, 2 sc), *«2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc» in ch-2 sp, 14 sc* 3 times, «2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc» in ch-2 sp, 11 sc.

Finish with 1 sl st in first sc.

cut the yarn and fasten the yarn threads.

(Total 8 ch, 72 sc)

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Symbols explained (US terms):

... ... times		Repeat the instructions, for example: " <i>*ch 1, 2 sc* 5 times</i> " would mean " <i>ch 1 followed by 2 sc, repeated five times</i> "
** ... ** ... times		Short repeats within a longer ones, for example: " <i>*ch 1, **1 sc** 2 times* 5 times</i> " would mean " <i>ch 1 and a repeat of 2 sc; all repeated 5 times</i> "
(Total ...)		Sums up number of used stitches, for example: " <i>1 sc (counts as ch 1), ch 2. (Total 2 ch, 1 sc)</i> " would mean " <i>amounts to 3 ch, used as 2 ch + 1 sc</i> "
(counts as...)		Replacement for first stitch on a round, for example: " <i>ch 3 (counts as 1 dc)</i> " would mean " <i>ch 3 used instead of 1 dc as the initial stitch</i> "
<<...>> in ...		Stitches to be crocheted in the same stitch, for example: " <i><<3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc>> in the next stitch</i> "
st		Stitch
lp		Loop
ch sp		Chain space
BLO		Back loop only
FLO		Front loop only
sl st		Slip stitch
ch		Chain
sc		Single crochet
hdc		Half double crochet
dc		Double crochet
ldc		Long double crochet
tr		Treble crochet
